SUBJECT: MSWG Safety Briefing Policy

Pursuant to CAPR 62-1, members of the Mississippi Wing will comply with the following policy in the implementation of CAPR 62-1.

Note: CAPR 62-1 and the MSWG Safety Briefing Policy have been revised in its entirety. All members are strongly encouraged to review the latest regulation carefully for a detailed description of the program changes.

Ref: CAPR 62-1

1. All members must receive a monthly safety education briefing IAW CAPR 62-1 para 3b.
2. Specific responsibilities for Commanders, Unit Safety Officers, Activity Directors/Commanders, Activity Safety Officers, Cadet Safety Officers and Members are outlined in CAPR 62-1 para 4.
3. All members must also receive an Operational Risk Safety Briefing IAW CAPR 62-1 para 3c(d). Participation in an activity without completing a required Operational Risk Safety Briefing is **prohibited**.
4. The monthly safety briefing attendance roster must be uploaded into eservices as soon as practical, but no later than 5 days following the briefing. In the event that this requirement cannot be met, the squadron commander must ensure that the attendance information is uploaded as stated above.

Noncompliance

The MSWG Director of Safety will closely monitor the program for compliance with this policy and with CAPR 62-1, and will advise the wing commander of any squadron's failure to comply. The wing commander will direct such corrective action as in his discretion may be necessary or appropriate in the circumstances. Such action may include, but shall not be limited to; suspension of squadron personnel from participation in any CAP activity, suspension of all members within a unit, and relocation of assigned aircraft.
